

LATAM Free Will, Agency, and Responsibility

CFA Midyear Seminar 3

The LATAM Free Will, Agency, and Responsibility project calls for applications to a three-week seminar in Bogota at Universidad de los Andes from July 12-30th, 2021. The theme of this year's seminar is Moral Responsibility.

For this year, we are planning (and very much hoping) to have an in-person seminar, although seminar plans will be adjusted as necessary in light of the pandemic and relevant travel constraints.

Unless we are forced to go remote, participants will reside in Bogotá during the time of the seminar and will be expected to dedicate their full time to it. They will receive a stipend of US\$2,500 (minus applicable taxes) and, in addition, their lodging will be covered by the project. Participants will also become members of the project and will be eligible to participate in a various awards and prize competitions.

Applicants must be graduate students (MA or PhD candidates) or early career scholars (having received their PhD not prior to June 2016) in Philosophy or related disciplines. We will also consider candidates with an exceptional research record, who have just initiated work on project-related themes and may benefit from participating in the seminar. Applicants to prior project seminars are encouraged to re-apply, regardless of whether they attended any seminar.

Due to the goals of the project, priority will be placed on candidates with a track record of successful work in Latin America or with the Latin American philosophical community, and with a research project in the Analytic tradition. However, applicants are *not* required to have a prior record of work on free will or related areas.

Applicants are required to submit the following documents by March 8, 2021:

- A complete CV (including contact information: phone and address)
- A letter of intent in explaining how participation in the seminar can help further their educational or career goals

- A writing sample (maximum 4,000 words) on any academic theme
- Graduate students must present (unofficial) transcripts of their grades (including GPA) from their home institution
- A copy of the first page of their passport

These materials should be submitted by e-mail attachment to freewill@uniandes.edu.co. The phrase "Seminar 3" should appear in the e-mail subject line. The only acceptable file formats are .doc and .pdf. Questions about the application process can be sent to the same e-mail address.
